WHEREAS, Article XIIID, Section 6 of the California Constitution requires the District to provide written notice of proposed fees and charges to all property owners and customers of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District has prepared a Notice of Public Hearing regarding the proposed rate increase for water, sewer and street sweeping services attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Mission Hills Community Services District to approve the Notice of Public Hearing regarding the proposed rate hearings conducted pursuant to Article XIIID, Section 6 of the California Constitution attached hereto as Exhibit "A" for mailing to all property owners and customers of the District.

This Notice of Public Hearing provides information regarding a proposed rate restructure in water, sewer and street sweeping rates for the District's water, sewer and street sweeping customers pursuant to the requirements of the California Constitution, Article XIII (commonly referred to as Proposition 218). At the Public Hearing, the District will consider all public comment in support and in opposition of the proposed rate restructure and increases and whether or not a majority protest exists pursuant to Proposition 218.

Reason for the Proposed Rate Restructure and Increases:

The rate increases are necessary for the District to continue to provide safe and reliable water, sewer and street sweeping services to the residents of the Mission Hills Community Services District. This proposed rate restructuring addresses deficiencies in the current rate structure. It emphasizes that the majority of the Districts costs are fixed and eliminates the need for winter averaging. It also addresses the District's deficit spending caused in part by increased operational, maintenance and capital costs and the loss of income due to drought restrictions and ambitious conservation efforts. Given that the proposed restructuring will generate revenue to cover current expenditures, it will be the District's focus to reduce future expenditures and provide the most cost effective services possible.

Majority Protest:

Proposition 218 mandates that customers directly responsible for the payment of the fees subject to the proposed rate changes or the property owner of the service address may submit a written protest against the proposed rates. If written protests are received from a majority of the affected customers or the property owners, the proposed rates will not be imposed.

In order to submit a valid protest, the protest must be in writing and must contain a statement that you protest the increase in rates. The protest must contain the service address and be signed by either the account holder or the property owner of the service address. The written protest must be received by the District Secretary at or before the close of the public hearing.

Written protests may be mailed or personally delivered to the District Secretary at:

Written protests will not be accepted by email or by facsimile. Verbal protests will not be counted in determining the existence of a majority protest. If valid written protests are presented by a majority of owners and/or tenants-customers, then the District will not increase the rates. Only one protest per parcel will be counted in determining whether or not a majority protest exists.
